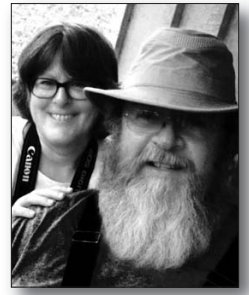

How Randy Brewster's Legacy of Giving Lives On

When Randy Brewster passed away in 2021, his wife Jennie established an endowment fund in his honor which will go towards supporting Victory Lane.



"Randy always had a big heart for giving" Jennie explained. "He was all in for Victory Lane which made it easy for me to be also."

This legacy of giving inspired people to want to give in his honor when he passed away. Jennie turned to the Henry County Community Foundation to set up a memorial endowment to honor her husband.

Because of Randy and Jennie's generosity, the endowment will continue to help support the work of Victory Lane forever. Jennie's hope is that the fund will continue to bring joy to children and families and show them God's love in the process.

"I didn't have the ability alone, but the group of people who reached out to me did," she shared. "Together, it will have the ability to impact so many more families each year. Randy was loved and through this love, generosity bloomed in his honor."

Victory Lane is committed, throughout each season, to build connections and community. We believe when we serve and care for each other, God faithfully produces the fruit. Here are a few examples of how He has provided:

- For our first decade, we needed family-centered sleeping facilities. Our new location, Mahoning Valley campground, is God's current answer to this prayer.
- We see families building community at well-attended monthly events like the winter skate party and summer pool party.
- We continue to see and hear stories of lives transformed through connections made at Victory Lane... Praise God!

I am eager to be leaving a dormant season that has lasted 5+ years. Through renewed clarity, I can already see Victory Lane entering a season of spring budding with the promise of a future harvest. In 2024, our Victory goals include...

- Fill both camps by March 31st and improve event participation by 20%.
- Raise \$100,000 annually for Randy Brewster endowment fund.
- Add a resource section to our website to equip others to celebrate families with disabilities.
